

Aegopodium podagraria 'Variegatum'	Snow on the Mountain- A vigorous grower in any location, Snow on the Mountain is peppered with white flowers in May and June. The plants grow to 10" and should be trimmed back after flowering for neater growth. They like sun and any soil type.

The flowers, best in partial shade are present from May until June. Most flowers are blue to pink on very short foliage - 6-8". The foliage are all unique and they look nice covering hillsides. Deadhead the flowers for best success. Tolerant of poor soil.
Arctostaphylos 'Uva-Ursi' Massachusetts	Bearberry- Glossy green foliage makes a lush ground cover in sunny areas. They will take it dry and even gravelly. In may they have white flowers above the 6" foliage.

Ceratostigma plumbaginoides	Dwarf Plumbago- Ourstanding fall color! Plumbago has glowing bright blue flowers from July until September. The foliage grows to 6" and they do best in full or partial sun.
Convallaria majalis	Lily of the Valley- Fragrant white flowers in May and June. Plant convallaria in full or partial shade for best results. The plants grow to 12", the flowers and foliage make nice cut flowers.

Delosperma 'Red Mountain' Delosperma c. 'Gold Nugget' Delosperma X 'Mesa Verde'	Hardy Ice Plant- Small 6" plant with leaves that turn red in winter. The first flowers appear in early spring in pinks and purples. Look for flowers again in fall. They are drought tolerant and work well in sandy soil!
Euonymus fortunei 'Colorata' Euonymus fortunei 'Kewensis'	Wintercreeper- Wintercreepers retain their leaves year round. It is best to trim them in spring to keep them full. In the fall look for their purple leaves. Plant in sun or part sun.
Galium odoratum	Sweet Woodruff- Bright green leaves that smell like vanilla. A low growing spreader for the shade. The white flowers are present in May and June.
